Sharing Information from Kent Community Service Providers



Visit Kent Young Carers online to see their latest January Newsletter

Kent Young Carers (KYC) is a countywide service for those residing in Kent aged 5-18yrs who are providing a form of care, supervision or support to a family member with: a long- term illness, disability including SEND, mental health illness or substance misuse issue.

KYC works with schools, communities, statutory and voluntary agencies to identify hidden and hard to reach Young Carers and offers free awareness training and information to all professionals. If your family is receiving support from services such as Early Help, please ensure that you make them aware that your child is registered with us and ask that they get in touch.

We support Young Carers in Kent to minimise the negative impacts of caring and to access social and educational opportunities and emotional support, highlighting the positive impacts of being a carer, such as increased resilience and empathy.

Our **Short Breaks** service is for children and young people with a mild to moderate disability aged 8-19yrs (inclusive), who live in Kent and require a level of additional support that makes accessing mainstream/ universal services unlikely.

This service is about enabling disabled children to have fun, gain independence, learn new life skills and develop, while families get to take a break from their caring role.





A few polite reminders ...

Parking - When dropping off or collecting your child please park considerately and ensure you are not obstructing drives, garages or access to roads. Please be respectful of our neighbours. We appreciate your support in this matter.



Black Trainers - A gentle reminder that black trainers are the school uniform footwear and other colours are not to be worn. Many thanks.

Polite Notice – When bringing your child to school, please can the Parent/Carer accompany the child to the school office and not drop off outside the gate - Years R-5. This includes Wrap Around Care. Thank you for your cooperation.



Clothing – Can you please ensure the children's clothes are labelled – we have had quite a few missing hoodies/ fleeces/jumpers/cardigans and some are being misplaced as they are unnamed.

Mornings – The gates open at 8.30am and the school day starts at 8.45am. If your child isn't in their classroom by 8.45 they might miss the morning register and will need to be signed in at reception. We know things happen on rare occasions but please do try to be earlier than later. Many thanks.
