Term 3 brought lots more fun learning and excitement and I am really looking forward to this term being just as full of hard-work, success, enjoyment and learning.

We are doing History this term and our focus is 'The Romans', with our key question being 'How did the Romans change Britain?'. For the course of this topic, we will be exploring who the Romans were, how they lived, how they invaded Britain, who Boudicca was and how they have influenced our lives today.

For our English lessons we will be focusing on a book called 'Oliver and the Seawigs.' We will be exploring this book in detail and by doing so, we will be focussing on expanding and enhancing both our reading and writing skills further. The children will be exploring how to write a newspaper report, as well as various other writing outcomes based on this book.
