Leeds Castle Trips

Some of our classes are learning about Castles and why Leeds castle is historically significant.

The first stone castle was built here in 1119. Later King Henry VIII transformed Leeds Castle from a fortified stronghold to a magnificent royal palace. Between 1517-1523 on his orders, major alterations were made so that he and his first wife Catherine of Aragon, could visit the castle in comfort.
